WHAT WAS THE YEAR OF 1985





## THE YEAR 1985:

The year began with the business manager resigning from his office and we're off for a election, th at had it's in and outs with the ballet committee chäcking with constitution and by-laws to straighten out who was elgible to run for this office. The Election was held and Brother John Pollock did win. The business office is going modern, we got a computer. The election of the third business agent for the use in the valley seemed to be paying off. The Executive Board was taking on the by-laws, by the up dating of them. Into the new year the work load was somewhat slow. In january we lost Harry Enochs. As the reports go on we are still fighting non union and other crafts doing our work. We did have ore sad function, a letter written by the committee for good unionism, members of the silent majority. Brother Ken McGrew spoke on this letter, stating that this could only showed a split within the local. The main reason for us being here, working for a common cause. Ou r pension plan went through some changes. We have monies going to one place and the talk of being able to sell more at a future date. With new members being taken in and trails being held, the business office reported that we lost 16 brothers in 1984. Our concern with health and welfare still stairs us in the face. We all talk of Glen Slaughter and Associated and nonies. Our office attended a meeting about shipyard workers and some of our sisters locals took a cut in wages to compete. Within the structure we heard reports about the J.E.T.C. and how the functioning, also the work load has not picked up and the use of the helpers was picking up at least in demand. This is one of our major problems, using this non-union program within our union structure. The contract dosen't define what they can or can't do. At this point we lost Brother Merl Steele. The business office was dealing with seminars of Workers Compensation and doctors roles in a Multi Phasic Programs. With on third of the year already passed the work load was still slow. We were sending our bussiness agents to De Laubus, Illinois for the sessions of Asbestos Abatement as one more tool for field development. The local started talking about an Organizer for some kind of use against non-union.. The Executive Board talked about it, the business office spoke of it, and the subject was brought to the floor at a regular meeting for the body to discuss. We agreed that this is a good idea but we would hold at this time. Also at this time we had a few brothers who were on trial and the president (Robert Young) was setting the time and the date. The International informed the local of an agreement with the electrians pertaining to penetrations. The struggle of Health and Welfare surfaced again. The Executive Board was proof reading the by-laws.





Talk about western state trustee was high lighted. General pickett duty was lowered to \$25.00 a day, so the business office could be more flexable. The thrid business agent time ran its full year and the local decieded we should retain the position, so on june 29th, Brother Willard Andrews won the job and we also picked one deligate for the Western State Conference, Brother Robert Cuthbertson went and enjoyed this conference. Our vacation plan and the interest on our monies seemed to have been discussed at the trust fund meeting by the trustee. Union Labor Life Medical Plan was doing some up dating on their plan. Reported at the time from the courts, that bankruptcy was no longer away out of a union contract. In Sacramento every year we have a Legislative Conference, we sent Brother Sciume, this summer the local was working on problems with the International and everybody was talking about the 75 cent raise, even a good tones were coming from the trade board committees. As the leaves turned colors the arbitrator took the interest of our vacation monies for the adminastration for this plan. Our Health and Welfare is on a month to month bases. The work load was still slow and we are still having problems with non-union and the helper situation. However our computer was working great and Dora has the programes in line. At the Sacramento Labor Finic the local won a free trip to Reno, which will be drawn for at the December meeting. We lost two Brothers Roy Thorstad and George Fugua. As the year closes so do the jobs, at this time the business managers job was up. The election was held and Greg Feere had the decided votes. We stood for a monent of silent for the passing of two more brothers, William Stien and Lonnie Treadway. We have gone through 1985 with the loss of some good friends, we've had our highs and our lows, but Local #16 has been here a long time, changes do come and we'll adjust to them just as we have in the past.
